



Minnesota N.R.A. & C.M.P. Regional Pistol Championship – JUNE 2-3, 2018

RANGE LOCATION: Oakdale Gun Club, 10386 N 10th St, Lake Elmo, MN. 55042. 3.5 miles east and one mile north of the intersection of I-94 and I-694 between St. Paul, MN, and Hudson, WI.

TOURNAMENT TYPE: Outdoor NRA Conventional Pistol Regional 2700 match, followed by CMP Service Pistol Excellence-in-Competition (EIC), 22 Rimfire CMP and NRA Distinguished Revolver matches.

TIME: The 3 minute preparation period begins at exactly 8:27am on both Saturday and Sunday, rain or shine. Competitors should be at their positions on the line by 8:15am. The statistical office will open at 7:35 for registration on Saturday. All competitors should be checked in by 8:05 am.

RULES: Current NRA & CMP conventional pistol rules will govern throughout the tournament. Use of eye protection, ear protection and empty chamber indicators are required.

INDIVIDUAL ELEGIBILITY: Open to all competitors. New shooters are welcome. The NRA Regional tournament does not require NRA membership, but NRA membership is encouraged.

TEAM ELIGIBILITY: Teams will consist of four firing members, one captain and/or coach and will represent either a club affiliated with the NRA (Rule 2.11), a law enforcement agency (Rule 2.14), a regular service or reserve unit (including the National Guard (Rule 2.13)). The team captain and/or coach may be firing members of the team. State Association teams may enter the team matches (Rule 2.12). State Association membership is required, pick-up teams are not allowed in a Pistol Regional (Rule 2.10). However, pick up teams shooting for fun are encouraged.

SCORING: All scoring will be done downrange by competitors after each 10-shot string. Competitors are responsible for replacing and repairing targets, and for turning in their completed and signed scorecards at the end of each match fired. Competitors may use official NRA scoring overlays to help determine shot value. The use of a plug type scoring device is limited to the NRA Referee only (Rule 14.3.1). Competitors must provide their own clipboard, staple guns, staples, and repair tape or pasters. If a NRA referee is not available, decisions will be made by a jury made up of range officers.

INDIVIDUAL ENTRY INFORMATION: Entries are limited to one relay of 30 shooters. There will be a separate relay for single event (i.e. .22-only) shooters, if necessary. Priority will be given in order to:

1. Reserved and pre-paid shooters competing in all three courses of fire.
2. Reserved but not prepaid shooters competing in all three courses of fire.
3. Reserved (pre-paid or not) shooters competing in the 22 match only.
4. Day of event walk-ons.

Reserved entries (entry form attached) with payment must be received by mail by Friday, the day before the match. Calling or emailing to reserve a spot without payment needs to happen no later than 6:00 pm by Friday, the day before the match. To reserve a spot or obtain additional information contact:

TEAM ENTRY INFORMATION: Registration for 4 man club, police, service, or state association teams will be on the day of the match.

If a competitor enters the team matches ONLY, a \$10.00 registration fee is required.
Any required NRA and State fees are included in the total fees of the 2700 part of the match.

SQUADDING: Squadding will be on a first come, first served basis. Competitors must check in with the Statistical Office 30 minutes prior to the start of their relay to fill out the entry form, pay and pick up their score cards. Those not firing all three pistols should be on the ends of the line.

CHALLENGES: A fee of \$2.00 will be charged for each challenge assuming the competitor and scorer cannot agree on the score of a shot. Only the Referee or Match Director is allowed to use plugs. The referee will be the sole authority for resolving challenges. See NRA rule 16 for the correct procedure.

CLASSIFICATION: The NRA classification system will be used in all matches. Individuals who have not been classified will fire in the Master class (Rule 19.7).

CATEGORIES AND CLASSES IN MATCHES: Awards be given only in the Civilian class, Open division subject to the conditions of the award schedule. Classes with less than 4 competitors will be moved to the next higher class until that class has at least 4 competitors. Masters & High Masters will compete for open (winner) awards only if there are not at least 4 competitors in that class. Matches will be shot "Open Division".

AWARD SCHEDULE: The NRA may provide the Regional Medallions and Classification Medals. (The NRA has discontinued Team medals.) Other monetary awards (if any) are furnished by the Oakdale Gun Club. No competitor may receive more than one monetary award in each match. All monetary awards will be mailed to competitors after the match.

TIME AND DATE - After the 45 caliber match, approx. 11:30 on Sunday

RULES: Current Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Competition Rules will govern the match.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to competitors, age 16 and older, pursuant to Rule 4 of the CMP Competition Rules. Military competitors must also comply with applicable regulations of their respective service. Competitors will be required to certify on their scorecard their eligibility to enter the match. NRA membership is not required.

ENTRY FEE: \$15.00 paid with cash or check only.

ENTRIES LIMITED: Entries will be limited to one relay of 30 competitors on a first-paid, first-served basis. Advanced registration is recommended. Entry fees must accompany your registration. Distinguished shooters may enter, but priority will be given to Non-Distinguished shooters. There must be at least 6 Non-Distinguished competitors in order to conduct the match.

COURSE OF FIRE - 30 SHOTS, NATIONAL MATCH COURSE

Stage 1	10 shots, slow fire, B6 target, 50 yards, 1 string of 10 shots in 10 minutes.
Stage 2	10 shots, timed fire, B8 target, 25 yards, 2 strings of 5 shots in 20 seconds.
Stage 3	10 shots, rapid fire, B8 target, 25 yards, 2 strings of 5 shots in 10 seconds.

PISTOL: Service Pistol: U.S. Pistol, Caliber .45, M1911 or M1911A1; U.S. Pistol, Caliber 9mm, M9, or the commercial equivalent of the same type and caliber (see Rules 6.3.3 - 6.3.5). Triggers must lift 4 lbs. when cocked. Pistols will be inspected for compliance and triggers will be weighed.

AMMUNITION: Any safe cartridge with metal-jacketed bullet in compliance with Rule 6.6.2.

AWARDS: Gold, silver and bronze achievement pins will be presented to competitors who's score equals or exceeds the achievement award scores listed in 5.11.3. Credit points toward distinguished designation will be awarded according to Table 9 in 9.2.6 with a minimum credit score listed in 9.2.7. Earned EIC pins and credit points will be awarded to qualifying competitors by the CMP or respective military service.

TIME AND DATE - After the 45 caliber match, approx. 11:30 on Sunday

RULES: Current Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Competition Rules will govern the match.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to competitors, age 16 and older, pursuant to Rule 4 of the CMP Competition Rules. Military competitors must also comply with applicable regulations of their respective service. Competitors will be required to certify on their scorecard their eligibility to enter the match. NRA membership is not required.

ENTRY FEE: \$15.00 paid with cash or check only.

ENTRIES LIMITED: Entries will be limited to one relay of 30 competitors on a first-paid, first-served basis. Advanced registration is recommended. Entry fees must accompany your registration. Distinguished shooters may enter, but priority will be given to Non-Distinguished shooters. There must be at least 6 Non-Distinguished competitors in order to conduct the match.

COURSE OF FIRE - 30 SHOTS, NATIONAL MATCH COURSE

Stage 1	10 shots, slow fire, B6 target, 50 yards, 1 string of 10 shots in 10 minutes.
Stage 2	10 shots, timed fire, B8 target, 25 yards, 2 strings of 5 shots in 20 seconds.
Stage 3	10 shots, rapid fire, B8 target, 25 yards, 2 strings of 5 shots in 10 seconds.

PISTOL: Standard Smallbore Pistol: Semi-automatic or revolver with open sights chambered for the .22 caliber long rifle cartridge (see Rule 6.4).

AMMUNITION: .22 caliber long rifle cartridge in compliance with Rule 6.6.2.

AWARDS: Gold, silver and bronze achievement pins will be presented to competitors who's score equals or exceeds the achievement award scores listed in 5.11.3. Credit points toward distinguished designation will be awarded according to Table 9 in 9.2.6 with a minimum credit score listed in 9.2.7. Earned EIC pins and credit points will be awarded to qualifying competitors by the CMP or respective military service.

THE NRA DISTINGUISHED REVOLVER COMPETITION

TIME AND DATE - After the .45 caliber match, approx. 11:30 on Sunday.

RULES: Current NRA Pistol Rules will govern the match. This match will be conducted per Rule 23, and the arms, ammunition, etc. will be governed by Rule 3.1.4.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all competitors who are eligible for NRA Pistol Competition, pursuant to Section 2 of the NRA Pistol Rules who are competing in the Regional match. NRA membership is not required.

ENTRY FEE: \$15.00 paid with cash, check, and/or current NRA points.

ENTRIES LIMITED: Entries will be limited to one relay of 30 competitors on a first-paid, first-served basis. Advanced registration is recommended. Entry fees must accompany your registration. Distinguished shooters may enter, but priority will be given to Non-Distinguished shooters. There must be at least 5 Non-Distinguished competitors in order to conduct the match.

COURSE OF FIRE - 30 SHOTS, NATIONAL MATCH COURSE

Stage 1	10 shots, slow fire, B6 target, 50 yards, 1 string of 10 shots in 10 minutes.
Stage 2	10 shots, timed fire, B8 target, 25 yards, 2 strings of 5 shots in 20 seconds.
Stage 3	10 shots, rapid fire, B8 target, 25 yards, 2 strings of 5 shots in 10 seconds.

REVOLVER: Factory manufactured revolver capable of chambering and firing a 158 grain lead round nose or lead semi-wadcutter bullet in a .38 Special cartridge. Triggers must have single and double action capability and must lift 2.5 lbs. when cocked for single action firing. Revolvers will be inspected for compliance and triggers will be weighed.

AMMUNITION: Any safe .38 caliber round using the 158 grain round nose or Semi-Wadcutter bullet only. Rule 3.1.4(e).

AWARDS: Credit points toward distinguished designation and earned Distinguished Revolver badges will be awarded by the NRA to competitors who qualify.

ELIGIBILITY - The competition is open to any able-bodied citizen of the United States, 16 years of age or older on the date of Match who is competing in the Regional Pistol Championship (Rule 23.1).
