



**2019 National Rifle Association
National Junior Rifle Indoor Sectional
Smallbore 3 Position & 4 Position Championships**

DATES: March 1, 2, 3, 2019

SPONSORS: Superior Junior Rifle Club & UW-Superior Rifle Club

LOCATION: University of Wisconsin – Superior Old Main Shooting Sports Range Facility.

MATCH FEES: Individual fees, \$15.00 per match; Team fees, \$15.00 per match

RULES:

Course of Fire 3 Position Championship: 20 shots in each of the following positions: prone, standing, and kneeling, one shot per bull's-eye. The positions must be fired in the order listed above.

Course of Fire 4 Position Championship: 10 shots in each of the following positions: prone, standing, sitting and kneeling. One shot per bull's-eye. The positions must be fired in the order listed.

Rules: Current NRA Smallbore Rifle Rules will govern the conduct of these tournaments.

Individual Categories: (Only one category may be entered)

Junior: Born 1999, 2000, 2001 or later

Intermediate Junior: Born 2002, 2003, 2004 or later

Sub-Junior: Born 2005 or later

NRA Membership Number: In order to enter scores of competitors in the NRA classification system, an NRA number must be used. If you are a member of the NRA, indicate your membership number. If you are not a NRA Member, use your classification card number if one has been assigned. If a special number has not been assigned, NRA will assign one when an accumulation of shots is sufficient (Rule 19.15).

Rifle: Rule 3.2, Any Rifle

Sights: Rule 3.7(a) Metallic only.

Firing Distance: 50 feet.

Target: Orion targets or Official NRA/USA A50 (3 Position Championship) & Official NRA A-17 (4 Position Championship) will be used. Targets may be hung at any height within rules and range limitations.

Challenges: Competitors may challenge the value of doubtful shot holes in accordance with procedures detailed in Section 16 of the NRA Rule Books. Challenge fee is \$3.00 per match. Since the Orion Scoring System will be used, NO target will be plugged by any competitor. The Orion Scoring System protested shot challenge system will be used for all protested shot values.



Time Limits: There will be a 5-minute equipment change and a 3-minute preparation period between stages (Rule 8.2).

Team Matches: Open to teams consisting of four (4) firing members and a Team Captain (who must be designated) who may also be a firing member of the Team. The Team must represent a single club (Rule 2.11). Team Tied Scores: Will be broken using Rule 15.8.

Awards: Provided by the National Rifle Association (NRA)

Relay 3 8am 3p

Relay 4 10am 4p

Relay 5 12:30pm 3p

Relay 6 2:30pm 4p

Relay 7 5pm 3p if required (fill last)

Relay 8 7pm 4p if required (fill last)

Sunday March 3

Relay 9 8am 4p

Relay 10 10am 3p

Relay 11 12:30pm 4p if required (fill last)

Relay 12 2:30pm 3p if required (fill last)

Relay reservation requests must be made via email or telephone as early as possible to be assured the relay that fits your shooters' or teams' schedule.

Teams should make every effort to reserve only relay spots they expect to fill. Coaches are responsible for communicating cancellations as soon as possible to maximize opportunities for other athletes to fill relay slots. *Teams not fielding reserved number of athletes will be charged half of individual fee for reserved slots.*

Scoring will be via Orion software. Secondary scoring in event of failure will be on official targets manually scored.
